VOTING IN NORTH DAKOTA

If you are a U.S. citizen and live in North Dakota, you have the right to vote!

Anyone who has lived in North Dakota for 30 days prior to an election can vote.

North Dakota does not require voter registration, but you do need to have a form of identification that can be used for voting. This means you should make sure you have proper identification with you before you go to the polls to vote.

HOW DO I VOTE?

Find information on where you vote at vote.nd.gov.

- You can vote by **absentee**, or by **mail**.
- You can vote at an **early** voting location.
- You can vote on **Election Day**.

VOTER IDENTIFICATION

You need one of the following forms of ID to vote:

- **North Dakota Driver's License**
- **North Dakota Non-Driver ID**
- **Tribal ID or Tribal Letter**
- **Long Term Care Certificate**

Identification and tribal government IDs or documents should have your **name, residential address, and date of birth**.

CORRECTING ADDRESSES

If you have moved since your ID was issued, you may need to update it before Election Day. The North Dakota Department of Transportation allows you to **update your address** and make **appointments** online for new IDs.

WHAT IF MY ID ISN'T UPDATED BEFORE ELECTION DAY?

If you are unable to update your identification, you still have the right to vote as a North Dakota resident if you are a U.S. citizen. If you do not get your identification updated, or find you do not have your identification with you when voting, you have two options:

OPTION 1: SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

You can **bring your non-updated identification along with supplemental information** that includes your updated address to the polling location on Election Day. **Supplemental documentation** that will be accepted includes a:

- Current bank statement or utility bill
- Paycheck or paystub
- Check or document issued by a federal, state, tribal, or local government
- Printed document issued by a college or university + student ID

OPTION 2: SET-ASIDE BALLOT

You can vote by **set-aside ballot** during early vote or on Election Day. This means you cast your ballot and it is placed in an envelope to be presented to the County Canvassing Board for review.

- **Within 13 days** after the election, you must **update or present** your **driver's license, non-driver ID, Tribal ID or documentation, or Long Term Care Certificate** before the County Canvassing Board meets.
- You may submit your identification to the **county auditor, in person or electronically**, and your ballot will be counted. You will be provided information about this process when voting a set-aside ballot.
